Central eyeing another title run

Cardinals return four starters from team that lost in state final

It wasn't until just a few weeks ago that Marquis Marshall finally was able to put the disappointment of last season's final basketball game to rest.

He and his Central Catholic teammates reached the state final but didn't win it, and it bothered him.

"I beat myself up about it," the Cardinals' junior wing said.

Marshall watched the tape of the PIAA Class A championship game over and over again, but the score never changed. Sewickley Academy always won.

"There were a lot of things I see (on that tape) I want to change," he said.

Marshall and the Cardinals may just get that chance. They can't erase last year's score, but they can settle one.

They return almost whole, with All-State guard Marcus Dawkins, 6-8 center Donovon Jack and point guard Joey Rys joining Marshall back in the starting lineup.

How often do you see a high school team win 30 games and then return practically intact?

Heck, how often do you see a Single-A school feature three potential Division I players?

It's no wonder they're favored to

win a state championship ... and another district championship ... and even the Berks Conference title they let slip away last year by giving up a 12-point lead to Reading High.

"I don't think they'll lose," said Holy Name coach Tony Balistrere, who knows the Cards as well as anyone. "They have a great chance to win the whole thing again. I don't see anything stopping them."

Almost no one did a year ago. They won their first 23 games before meeting Reading High, and it took one of the greatest comebacks in Berks playoff history in what became one of the county's all-time classics to do it. Nine months later the Cards are undeniably better.

Dawkins, a 6-3 senior wing, is arguably the best all-around player in the county. He's certainly the most dynamic and flamboyant. He fit with the Cards like a glove last season after playing his first two seasons for Reading High.

Jack, an emerging talent who already has five Division I offers, has grown two inches to 6-8. Maybe 6-9. And he's just a junior. His best days, no doubt, are ahead.

Rys, a 5-10 senior, is everything you want in a point guard on a championship team: athletic, comcontinued on page 9

The Knights did. They tried to go inside to Weglinski, their leading scorer, but the Generals doubled up on him, and he made just 2-of-9 shots in the second half and 5-of 16-overall.

"We were trying to get inside all night, and Demerik had a rough night," Redding said. "I think he got a little frustrated that some of his shots weren't falling."

"Our big guys stepped up and played well on their post player," Moore said.

Walker pulled down a dozen rebounds and 6-5 Division I prospect Xavier Harris grabbed 11. The Generals grabbed 59 rebounds to Reading's 31.

Redding was disappointed at a second close loss to a top team in the span of nine days. Reading lost at Chester after leading in the fi nal minutes.

"We've got young guys that have to (learn to) fi nish games," he said. "Trying, in our home tournament, is not execution. It's a failure."

An easy pick for me: It was Reading High's 62-57 win over Central Catholic in a Berks Conference semifinal at the Sovereign Center.

The Red Knights rallied from a 12-point deficit to hand the Cardi-

nals their first loss. I wrote that it was "rollicking, mesmerizing and unforgettable," and, nine months later, it seems every bit of that, and more.

In the days that followed numerous people came up to me — longtime basketball fans — telling me it was the best Berks basketball game they had ever seen. Some said it was just the best basketball game they had ever seen, period.

The play was at the highest caliber, and the comeback was incredible, the Red Knights scoring an amazing 13 points in a 90-second span.

The matchup had the added drama of Central transfer Marcus Dawkins going against his former Reading teammates for the first time.

Not surprisingly, Dawkins supplied the highlight of the game when he swatted away a Trenity Burdine dunk attempt. And, as they say, the crowd went wild.

A Reading-Central rematch looms a few weeks down the line. If it's half as good as last year's you won't want to miss it.

Schuylkill Valley (18-4) hadn't won a Berks playoff game since it won the county championship in 1976. Under the current four-division format, the Panthers had made eight previous appearances in the quarterfinals. Each one ended in defeat.

"It's exciting, it's really exciting," Panthers coach Chris Gallo said. "It's obviously been a goal to play in the Sovereign Center. It's nice to finally get there. I felt like we should have been there a few years ago, but we didn't get there.

"This is a different team. They're a different group. They've battled through adversity. I'm very proud of them."

Berks III champ Schuylkill Valley will take on Berks I champ Reading High, a 60-39 quarterfinal winner over Wyomissing, in the semifinals at 8 p.m. Wednesday. Against the Blazers (12-10), Yarde was equally effective on the perimeter and near the basket. He made 9-of-17 shots from the floor and 12-of-12 at the line, helping to keep Boone from getting closer than 12 points in the second half. He also had six rebounds and six assists.

"This has to rank up there with the best performances I've ever coached," Gallo said. "He just really played well and made them try to cover him. He went to the basket. He took the right shots. He does a lot of different things for us."

For the Mifflin girls, senior Alexis Wright's 17 points and 12 rebounds were key in the win over the Wilson Bulldogs. The title is Gov. Mifflin's ninth but its first since 1999. The win was Mifflin coach Rick Bausher's 450th.
