

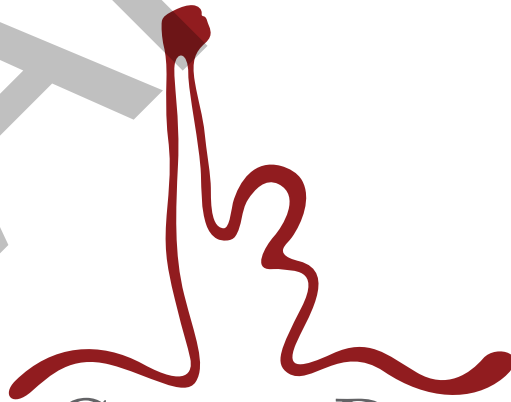

Scouting Reports

SEPTEMBER 3, 2010

Gov. Mifflin (7-5) vs. Wilson (11-2)

(Last season's final records in parentheses)

Kickoff: Tonight, 7, at Gurski Stadium.

Last season: Wilson won 42-7.

Notable: Mustangs and Bulldogs meet in season opener for the fifth straight year; Mifflin won the first two, Wilson the last two by a combined 56 points. ... Wilson leads the series 28-23. ... Bulldogs are ranked No. 4 in the state in Class AAAA by the Pennsylvania Football News, No. 9 by *rodfrisco.com*; they are not ranked by the Harrisburg Patriot-News. ... Bulldogs bring five starters back on a defense that was ranked No. 2 overall in Berks a year ago. ... Wilson coach Doug Dahms has not committed to a starting tailback, saying Rodney Gillen, Brad Ohlinger and Demetrious Young all figure in the mix, as does Erick Schmeck, who missed time in camp with a broken jaw. ... Dahms said it appears that all-league DT Nuku Hill could be lost for the season with a stress fracture in his back. He was hurt late last season and has recovered significantly. ... Connor Mathias and Julian Carabello will be Wilson QB Zach Zweizig's main targets at WR. They combined for just seven catches as backups last season. ... Mustangs FB Zach Schmidt and QB Vinny Garipoli combined for more than 2,000 rushing yards last season. They will, however, be running behind an almost entirely new offensive line. Only C Matt Koshinski returns there. ... LB Paul Schroeder returns to lead the Mifflin defense; he is one of only three starters back on that side of the ball.

Quotable: "I think we will be (better than last season). I don't know if we'll be better soon enough." — Mifflin coach Mick Vecchio.

SEPTEMBER 10, 2010

Wilson (1-0) vs. Manheim Central (1-0)

Kickoff: Tonight, 7, at Gurski Stadium.

Last season: Manheim Central won 29-27.

Notable: Highly ranked teams meet for the third straight season. Each of the past two matchups featured big comebacks and came down to wire, with the home team holding on each time. ... Bulldogs lead the series, which began in 1949, 4-3. The series resumed after a 47-year hiatus with a pair of games in 1998-99, when Wilson briefly moved to Section 2 of the Lancaster-Lebanon League, each team winning on its home field. ... Bulldogs survived late scare last week, with Matt Tietbohl intercepting a pass on the final play to prevent a Gov. Mifflin score and preserve a 21-14 victory. ... Bulldogs got 100-yard efforts from each of their running backs, Rodney Gillen and Brad Ohlinger, but struggled with the passing game, managing just 21 yards. ... Bulldogs are ranked No. 6 in the state in Class AAAA by the Pennsylvania Football News, No. 10 by *rodfrisco.com*. ... Barons are ranked No. 5 in the state in Class AAA by PFN, No. 8 by *rodfrisco.com*. ... Manheim QB Chase Moyer threw for 244 yards in his first start, with Derek Hart making eight catches for 211 yards and four TDs. ... Barons have gone to a Spread attack, to take advantage of Moyer's arm, and the fact that he's not as much of a running threat as their past QBs. ... Zach Zweizig completed 19-of-34 passes for 257 yards last season against Manheim, leading the Bulldogs back from a 26-7 deficit into a 27-26 fourth-quarter lead. Wilson out gained Manheim 321-264. ... Barons went on to finish 15-1 and play in the PIAA Class AAA championship game; the Bulldogs finished 11-2.

SEPTEMBER 17, 2010

Wilson (2-0) vs. Reading High (0-2)

Kickoff: Tonight, 7, at Shirk Stadium.

Series: Bulldogs lead 19-5 after last season's 61-19 win.

Notable: Junior LB Matt Tietbohl made another big play at the end of last week's 25-22 win over Manheim, forcing a fumble in the final minutes as the Barons were moving into position for the tying or go-ahead score. A week earlier he picked off a Gov. Mifflin pass to end the game and secure a 21-14 win. ... Bulldogs got an all-around standout effort on defense, limiting the Barons to 117 total yards, just 23 in the second half. Over the final three quarters the Bulldogs allowed a net of zero passing yards. ... Tietbohl led the team with five tackles; LB Erick Schmeck had a pair of tackles for losses; LB Junior Joseph had a sack; and CBs Rodney Gillin and Sheldon Hannibal-Nixon each played strong in pass coverage. ... Gillin rushed for 213 yards and three TDs and leads Berks in rushing with 350 yards. ... Bulldogs coach Doug Dahms was uncertain at midweek if WR/S Connor Mathias would play; he was kept out of the Manheim game with hamstring problems. ... Red Knights were overwhelmed at Owen J. Roberts, giving up 228 rushing yards and three TDs to Ryan Brumfield in 58-6 loss. ... Knights lost their top two-way player, Denny Nazario, early in that game with an ankle injury; his status for tonight is uncertain. ... Bulldogs have won six straight in the series. Last year's 42-point victory was their largest in the series; a year earlier they won by 40. ... The teams met 21 times as Lancaster-Lebanon League Section 1 foes, starting in 1987; Wilson won 16 of the 21 meetings. ... Bulldogs are No. 5 in the state in Class AAAA by the Pennsylvania Football News and No. 10 in two other rankings.

Quotable: "If we get off to a good start, it could get ugly. If we leave them in it, the more confidence they'll get, and the better they're going to play." — Wilson coach Doug Dahms. Quotable: "To me, this is a heart-check game for us. Are we gonna go out there and battle? It's about who we are as a team, about who we are as people. Are you a fighter, or are you not? We've got to find that out." — Reading High coach Preston McKnight.

SEPTEMBER 24, 2010

Wilson (3-0) vs. McCaskey (2-1)

Kickoff: Tonight, 7, at Gurski Stadium.

L-L Section 1 records: Opener for both.

Series: Bulldogs lead 28-7-1, with eight straight wins, longest in series history. Wilson won 24-14 last year.

Notable: Bulldogs will be without QB Zach Zweizig for three weeks after he suffered a dislocated throwing shoulder early in last week's 60-0 win over Reading High. He'll be replaced by 6-foot junior Seth Klein, who threw just one pass — a 33-yard TD pass to Jacob Morgan — after taking over for Zweizig last week. ... Bulldogs have run on 72 percent of their plays to date, and that figure's likely to rise in the coming weeks. A year ago they ran just 57 percent of the time. ... WR/S Connor Mathias was practicing again this week and is expected to play tonight. He missed the last two games and most of the Week 1. ... Shutout was Bulldogs' first since beating Cedar Crest 31-0 in Week 5 last year. They had not shut out the Red Knights since 1995. ... Bulldogs' Rodney Gillin is averaging 12.3 yards per carry and is third in Berks in rushing with 466 yards. ... Red Tornado led 7-3 at the half before falling 17-7 last week to defending PIAA Class AA champ Lancaster Catholic. QB Jonathan Hulyo threw for 161 yards and a TD, but was also picked off three times. ... Red Tornado makes up for a lack of size on defense with an attacking style that limited Lancaster Catholic to 106 rushing yards and 275 total yards. ... RB Markeith Williams leads McCaskey offense with 315 rushing yards and six TDs. ... McCaskey D has 10 takeaways. ... McCas-

Zweizig, Garipoli are in it to win it

Two years later, they are senior leaders in Berks' prime matchup

JUST LIKE the first time they faced off, all eyes will be on quarterbacks Zach Zweizig and Vinny Garipoli tonight when Wilson and Gov. Mifflin meet to open the football season. This time, though, two years after each was thrown into the fire as unknown sophomores, Zweizig and Garipoli will be the featured attractions.

They won't simply be trying to avoid mistakes

and manage the game — as they were in the 2008 opener, after preseason injuries saw both teams lose their No. 1 quarterbacks. They'll be trying to win it. Each has proved he can.

Zweizig managed the Bulldogs to a 4-0 start in 2008 before turning it back over to Steve Huber. A year ago, as the full-time starter, he set Wilson's single-season passing record and led the Bulldogs to 11 wins and the Lancaster-Lebanon League Section 1 champi-

onship.

Garipoli, thrust into the starting role when Casey Hughes was injured, had a shaky debut at Gurski Stadium. He completed just two passes, for 11 yards, in that 35-14 loss, but showed a sign of things to come by breaking away for a 39-yard TD run late in the game.

He went on to run for 18 scores and lead the Mustangs to the Inter-County League Section 1 title before his season was ended by a serious knee injury in the district playoffs.

That injury carried over into last season, and it wasn't until mid season that he was back in form and running the Mustangs' Mid-Line Option full throttle.

"Now he's totally healthy, and that's big," Mifflin coach Mick Vecchio said. "Coming off the ACL surgery he was thinking about things a little bit. Now, he's back to being a good football player."

With Garipoli teamed with fullback Zach

Barons vs. 'Dogs: another classic?

Connor Mathias' playing status figures to be a key for Wilson

DOUG DAHMS reached for his repair kit when things started breaking down late last week against Gov. Mifflin, but the Wilson football coach couldn't find exactly what he needed.

That's probably because Connor Mathias, arguably the Bulldogs' most important two-way player, was standing on the sidelines, pads off, his day done after one quarter when his nagging hamstring problems forced him out. "He's the glue that holds a lot together," Dahms said.

Mathias is expected to be the Bulldogs' go to guy at wide receiver. He's the lone veteran in the secondary, playing the all-important safety spot in the three-man alignment.

Bulldogs dominate vs. Streaks

Wilson safety Connor Mathias said he and his defensive teammates don't set specific goals in terms of yardage or points allowed when they go into a game. They simply want to get off the field as quickly as possible.

"We like to go out there and get the first three-and-out at the beginning of the game," Mathias said.

The second-seeded Bulldogs continued to record three-and-outs throughout the first half of their District 3-AAAA playoff opener Friday night against 15th seeded Manheim

Township.

Heck, Mathias and the Wilson defense were on the field less than the band. That's how efficient they were.

They turned back the Blue Streaks repeatedly, holding them without a first down in the first half and setting the tone in a dominating 48-21 drubbing that sends them on to a much-anticipated quarterfinal against Cumberland Valley next week back at Gurski Stadium.

The Bulldogs (11-0) were pretty good on offense, too, scoring on five of their six possessions as Rodney Gillin again ran wild and Mathias had a pair of touchdown catches.

They were especially impressive on defense, completely stonewalling the Lancaster-Lebanon League's

third-most productive offense.

The Blue Streaks (5-6) averaged 379 yards per game during the regular season but couldn't move the chains a lick in the postseason.

They lost 6 yards on their first series, came up short on their second, then saw their third possession turn into a disaster when Mathias jumped a sideline route and took it back 30 yards for a touchdown and 14-0 Wilson lead midway through the first quarter.

It only got worse for the Blue Streaks, who saw Gillin slip through them for three touchdowns and 172 first-half yards and the Bulldogs build a 42-0 halftime lead.

"We were coming in here thinking
