New-look Bulldogs continue fast start, roll over Roberts

Playing at faster pace, Wilson moves to 3-0

Make no mistake about it. Matt Coldren is excited to see his Wilson basketball team off to such a fast start this season. He just wishes the Bulldogs had been challenged a little more often before their Berks Conference opener tonight at Ex-

"The schedule's kind of hurt us so far," Coldren said Monday after the Bulldogs dispatched visiting Owen

Even with 0.J. Roberts 36 just one return starter, Zach Zweizig, the typically slow-starting Bulldogs (3-0) have breezed, winning by an average

That was the case against the Wildcats (1-5), who offered little resistance.

margin of 23.3 points, tops in Berks.

The Bulldogs had their way with them, running off 13 straight points early in the second quarter to build a 17-point lead.

Coldren substituted liberally, running two and three players in at a time, and everyone who got on the floor contributed.

Zweizig, one of Berks' best allaround players, led the way with 13 points on just 10 shots.

The Bulldogs also got strong play from Maulvi Williams and Julian Carabello, who spearheaded the defensive pressure and combined for 14 points.

Jacob Morgan and Seth Klein added some offensive punch off the bench, combining for 16 points. They provide the kind of depth Coldren is counting on as he plans

to play a more up-tempo, attacking style.

The Bulldogs have generally been a deliberate, halfcourt team, but Coldren likes the athleticism of this group so much that he plans to play at a fast pace and to utilize a lot of different players.

"This whole new style is different for me, but it suits the kind of kids we have right now," Coldren said.

We're trying to play to our strengths.

"We have very good athletes. I don't know if we've ever had a group of kids, as a whole, as fast and as athletic as this group. I mean Jacob Morgan can run and jump, Maulvi Williams can run and jump, Julian Carabello can, too,'

The Bulldogs forced 22 turnovers and got up and down the floor continued on page 12

Zweizig has evolved into more than just a scorer

T SHOULD COME as no surprise that Zach Zweizig would sooner pass the ball than

As the quarterback on Wilson's football team he did plenty of passing, throwing for nearly 3,900 yards during his two-plus seasons behind center.

So it wasn't hard for him to pass up a bunch of easy shots the other night at Fleetwood, dishing to open teammates.

"I'd rather have an assist than two points," said the 6-4 senior forward. "I've always been like that."

That part of his game has been a constant since he broke into the Bulldogs lineup as a freshman.

You didn't need to be Nostradamas at that juncture to see him becoming a 1.000-point scorer, which he'll achieve with his first point tonight against Twin Valley.

What makes his coach, Matt Coldren, so happy is to see how Zweizig's game has evolved since those early days and how he's become a complete player, able to win games with his defense, rebounding, passing or shooting.

"As a freshman, I knew he was going to be special, but he strictly wanted to shoot," Coldren said. "As the years have gone by he has become so much more valuable to us than just as a shooter.


"His whole game has really come a long way, and I'm really proud of that, because as a freshman it was a chore to get him to want to guard."

Because Zweizig's defensive skills weren't up to snuff, Coldren sat Zweizig when the Bulldogs faced that powerhouse 30-1 Reading High team at the Geigle.

'I didn't play him because he couldn't guard anyone they had," Coldren said. "It was a learning process. He got to understand what it was that I wanted him to do."

Zweizig has emerged as one of the best players ever to play for the Bulldogs. His next point will see him become just the fourth player in program history to reach 1,000, joining Chris Finch, Shane Stafford and Josh Smith.

It'll be a special moment for him, one he wants to share with friends and family, and one he wants to accomplish on his home court. That's why he took just two shots the other night and why he didn't play in the

second half - much to the disappointment of a small group of Fleetwood students who were holding up signs with "1,000" on them, anticipating Zweizig's milestone basket.

"Some of the names up there are pretty good players," Zweizig said of Wilson's all-time scoring list, "so it's an honor to be there with them."

The feat is even more impressive when you consider that points aren't easy to come by in a Wilson system that emphasizes a controlled pace and playing defense. The Bulldogs like to play in the 40s, not the 60s or 70s.

The feat is also impressive because of all the injuries Zweizig has had to overcome. He tore the ligaments off the bone of his right elbow early in his freshman football season. Last year he missed 10 basketball games because of hand and knee injuries. This season he missed a month of football after separating his right shoulder.

"He's a tough kid," Coldren said. "I think (all of those injuries) make him appreciate his time. I told our seniors that their time is coming to the end, and they need to make the most of every moment, and I think he does do that."

Those injuries, particularly the shoulder separation in September. may have scared off some football recruiters. (Apparently, they didn't see him throw 41 times, for 285 yards, against eventual District 3-AAAA champ Cumberland Valley in November.)

That shoulder injury didn't dissuade everybody.

Zweizig last week received a scholarship offer to play football at Holy Cross. He has a visit at Bucknell later this month and will likely receive an offer.

He also has a chance to play both sports at the next level. Kutztown and Franklin & Marshall have offered that opportunity.

So, as he's done for several years, Zweizig will wrestle with the decision of which sport, or sports, to play in college — a decision he'll try to make soon, what with the Feb. 2 national signing date approaching.

"I love football and basketball," he said. "I get the question so many times: 'Do you like football better or basketball better?' I honestly can't say."

On target


Exeter's Dominic Seelig, the Berks Conference's top free throw shooter with an .884 percentage, has hit 19-of-20 from the line since Dec. 23. ... Wilson's Jacob Morgan doesn't have enough attempts to rank among the Berks free throw leaders, but he's made 13-of-14 from the line, a .928 percentage.

In the Cards


